## INVESTIGATION STATEMENT TO BE POSTED FOR SEVEN DAYS

An investigation conference was held by electronic mail. The participants were:

Jason MacKay, on behalf of the Petitioner, PSE of Washington.

Cheryl Wolf, on behalf of the Employer.

Dario de la Rosa, on behalf of the Commission.

This statement is issued pursuant to WAC 10-08-130 to state the stipulations made by the parties and to control the subsequent course of proceedings. WAC 391-25-220 requires posting of this statement on the employer's premises for a period of at least seven days.

- 1. The following matters were resolved during the course of the conference:
  - a. The Public Employment Relations Commission has jurisdiction in this matter under Chapter 41.80 RCW.
  - b. The petitioner, PSE of Washington, is a lawful labor organization qualified to act as bargaining representative under RCW 41.80.005(7).
  - c. The representation petition was timely filed.
  - d. None of the parties claim that an unfair labor practice charge has been filed that should be treated as a blocking charge.
  - e. The description of an appropriate bargaining unit:

All full-time and regular part-time non-supervisory employees in Facilities Operations, Custodial Services Unit, at the Pullman

campus of Washington State University, excluding supervisors, confidential employees, and all other employees.

- f. The correct eligibility list is the list dated June 19, 2014, prepared by the employer. To be eligible, an employee must have been employed in the bargaining unit on July 10, 2014, and must remain an employee on the date of the tally.
- g. There were no requests that the notices and ballots be reproduced in a language other than English or for any disability accommodations.
- 2. There will be a cross-check conducted upon receipt of employment records from the employer bearing the signatures of the eligible employees to compare with the authorization cards submitted by the union.

The Commission will honor an employee's written request to revoke their authorization card for the purposes of the cross-check provided such request is submitted before July 18, 2014. (WAC 391-25-410). The cross-check will occur **no sooner than July 21, 2014**. The employer is instructed to provide the Commission with employment records that bear the employees names and signatures on or before July 18, 2014.

3. The following matters remain in dispute between the parties:

The parties disagree about the inclusion of John DeWolf, the Custodian in the Intercollegiate Athletics Department, in the proposed bargaining unit. The employer claims DeWolf does not share a community of interest with employees in the Facilities Operations, Custodial Services Unit. If DeWolf shares a community of interest with the proposed bargaining unit, the bargaining unit description will be amended to reflect his inclusion. The employer's request to resolve the community of interest question before the tally was denied.

Any objections to the foregoing must be filed at the Olympia office of the Commission, in writing, within 10 days following the date of this statement and shall, at the same time, be served upon each of the other participants named above. This statement becomes part of the record in this case as binding stipulations of the parties, unless modified for good cause by a subsequent order.
