Benefits Open Enrollment for 2019

Enrollment from November 1 to November 30, 2018

Open Enrollment is the one time each year when you can make changes to, and enroll in, certain benefits for the upcoming plan year. Additional details can be found on the HRS <u>Open Enrollment website</u> or in <u>For Your Benefit</u>, the Public Employees Benefit Board (PEBB) October newsletter.



During Open Enrollment, employees can:

- Change medical and/or dental plans.
- Reinstate previously waived coverage without proof of loss of coverage.
- Waive eligible family members from their coverage.
- Enroll eligible family members without proof of loss of coverage.
- Enroll or re-enroll in a Flexible Spending Account (FSA) and/or Dependent Care Assistance Program (DCAP) for 2019.
- Designate 2019 Health Savings Account (HSA) annual elections.
- Change medical premium deduction to pre- or post-tax (IRC Section 125).
- Change tax status of a domestic partner or dependent (IRC Section 152) by completing the Declaration of Tax Status form.
- Re-attest to the Spousal Premium Surcharge Questionnaire.

Most of the changes can be made online by creating an account at https://fortress.wa.gov/hca/ecoveragepebb. Hardcopy forms will be available November 1 at http://hrs.wsu.edu/open-enrollment/ or in the HRS Pullman office, located in the French Administration building, room 139.
