Wildfires

[Updated September 4, 2020] There are several active wildfires in Washington State, Northern California, and Colorado. In Washington, the Evans Canyon Fire is actively burning in Yakima and Kittitas County. Lightning started two wildfires in Northern CA's Bay Area, currently among the biggest in the state's history. Colorado's fires, although over three-quarters contained, still affect air quality and are on record as being the largest in their state's history.
