Remember to purchase CGMs through a network pharmacy

Continuous glucose monitors (CGMs) are only covered under the prescription drug benefit except for members who have Medicare as their primary coverage. This means you need to purchase your CGM supplies at a network pharmacy for UMP to cover your supplies. To find a network pharmacy, visit the Prescription drug coverage webpage and use the Pharmacy Locator Tool.

Weighing treatment options for chronic joint or lower back pain?
